

Trunch Parish Council

The March meeting of Trunch Parish Council was held on Wednesday 2nd March.

Present were 10 Parish Councillors, County Councillor W Northam, District Councillor N Coppack and PCSO R King. Also present were five members of the public.

District Councillor Coppack reported that the Planning Development Committee has approved the building project on Cornish Avenue but the development proposed for Binham was refused. You may wonder what that has got to do with us? The Housing Association that is building the houses needs to use the money made from the Binham project, which includes open market housing, to finance the Trunch project. They are currently re-assessing the project prior to resubmitting it. Sorry if it doesn't make sense but it's the best that I can do. It will be a great pity if we lose this project for affordable housing.

A member of the public reported that he has a petition objecting to the planning application on the land at the rear of 35,37 and 39 Trunch road Mundesley and urged members of the Council to object to the application.

PCSO King reported that there had been no crimes reported in Trunch during the period 3rd Feb to 2nd Mar. Speed checks had been carried out in the village and no vehicles were caught speeding.

There were several reports of potholes, flooding etc and these have been passed to NCC to add to their ever increasing list. Some of the potholes are getting dangerous and the Clerk will ask the NCC for a timescale for the repair work.

The public meeting regarding the Playing Field was not well supported. The Clerk will write to the Trunch Village Society and ask if they would be prepared to take this project forward on behalf of the Parish Council and the village. It was felt that there is a problem of communication in the village and the Trunch Village Society are working on ways to deal with this problem.

It was agreed that a separate meeting needs to be held once the old pavilion has been demolished in order to discuss the future of the playing field in general and whether a new pavilion is needed.

A bench, kindly donated by a parishioner, has been ordered and will soon be installed by the play area.
